PARKING ON CONNINGTON CRESCENT

Sadly, I have received further complaints about the parking of some Longshaw parents on Connington Crescent during school drop off and collection times.

Whilst I appreciate that parking along Connington Crescent may not be the easiest, I can only stress once again that parking across resident driveways; on grass verges, yellow zig-zag lines and stopping in the middle of the road to drop children off at the school gates preventing other vehicles to pass is not acceptable.

I am concerned essentially that the careless parking / driving of a few is putting Longshaw children at risk of serious injury whilst also creating unnecessary tension between parents and local residents.

I have been liaising with the Traffic Enforcement Team, Active Travel Officer; Highways & Traffic Management Senior Officer; Chingford Police; Cllr Fitzgerald and local residents to look at ways in which this issue can be resolved.

As a result of continued complaints from residents Waltham Forest Traffic Team are moving forward on a proposal by Cllr Fitzgerald to introduce double yellow lines on Connington Crescent, enforced by Waltham Forest traffic team. If local residents support this proposal double yellow lines will be introduced in April 2019.

It's a shame that such measures need to be taken but without the full cooperation of every parent, it seems like this option may go ahead.

My priority (and hopefully yours) is that all the children at Longshaw are kept safe—please can I urge everyone therefore to park and drive as safely as possible as opposed to doing what may be more convenient.
