Message from Mrs Woods

Thank you to all parents who were able to attend our Parent Information sessions on 31st October. We felt it was a helpful opportunity for us to take you through some of the work that is underway to support school improvement and what we'll be continuing to put in place over the coming year.

One of the key things that I have been reflecting on is how we can communicate even more clearly and often with you. Alongside United Learning and our local governing board (LGB), we very much recognise the positive role you already play in Longshaw life. However, it was clear from some of your feedback that there is even more we can do to together.

I will be writing in the next couple of weeks to set up and invite you to a series of Parent Forums. This time together can be used to:

- Give parents first hand updates about what is going well in the school. For example, asking pupils to share some work and talk about their current learning.
- Focus on one or two key topics that we discuss and explore in some depth; for example, how can we use social media better to communicate with parents.

These Forums will obviously sit alongside the invaluable work of the Longshaw Academy Friends (LAF) and our LGB, but will be very much distinct from that. I look forward to sharing more details over the coming weeks and hope many of you will choose to join us for them.


